A 1974 graduate of Point Pleasant High School, Edward James (Ted) Kinghorn was an active in both sports and student activities. An outstanding soccer player, Ted was selected as a member of the All-State team. As a student leader, Ted was president of the local Key Club, as well as New Jersey District Governor.

Kinghorn left Senator Thurmond's office in 1985 to find Kinghorn & Associates, LLC. Since then he has founded numerous grass roots organizations, research consortiums, and advocacy groups.

Never one to forget his roots, Ted founded the Jack Watson-Key Club Public Service Endowment in 1992. The endowment, which recognizes the dedication of longtime Key Club advisor and school administrator Mr. Jack Watson, still provides scholarships to Point Pleasant High School graduates.
