Dr. Marie Liguori Williams graduated from Point Pleasant High School in 1973. She was Class President in her senior year and she actively participated in the sports of basketball, field hockey and track. After graduation, she attended Immaculata College where she graduated with a degree in Biology and Chemistry. At Immaculata College, Marie played basketball on a team that won the Women's National Collegiate Championship. Immaculata became the first women's team ever to headline a game at Madison Square Garden where almost 13,000 fans came to see their game. The team was selected to serve as a Goodwill Ambassador by the United States Government in a tour of Australia that included a series of basketball games against teams from that country.



Dr. Williams attended Ohio College of Podiatric Medicine from 1978-1982. Upon graduation she did a two-year residency program at Southeastern Medical Center in North Miami Beach, Florida. She currently practices in North Miami Beach and is board certified in Foot and Ankle Surgery. Along with her practice, Dr. Williams is Director of the Residency Program at Parkway Regional Medical Center, a member of that hospital's Executive Committee and Chairman of the Department. At the Parkway Wound Care Clinic, Dr. Williams is involved in a research project on testing a bio-engineered skin graft for treatment of wounds that refuse to heal naturally. She also serves as an Adjunct Professor for the Barry University School of Podiatric Medicine.

Dr. Williams is active in many community activities with the Hollywood YMCA. She also coaches basketball for 13 year olds.

Marie currently resides in Hollywood Hills, Florida with her husband Jim, a 1972 graduate of Point Pleasant High School and their three children, Jaime (age 14), Michael (age 13) and Brian (age 5).
