J. Craig Sulaitis is a 1968 graduate of Point Pleasant High School. Craig participated in football, cross country, soccer, basketball and track. Basketball honors included the Asbury Park Press All Shore Class C, Ocean County Observer - All County, New York Daily News - Honorable Mention - All State, and the 1967-1968 MVP Point Pleasant High School Booster Award.

Upon graduating from Point Pleasant High, he attended York College, York, Pa. on a basketball scholarship.
